The Pastors Voice

Our Lady of Guadalupe - "I am your mother"

At dawn, as Juan Diego passed a hill named Tepeyac, he suddenly heard songbirds burst into harmony. Then, a sweet voice called him by name in Náhualt, his native language: "*Juanito, my dear Juan Diego.*" He followed the sweet voice, and then he saw a glowing figure on the hill.

In that first encounter she said to him in part . . . "Know and understand well, you the most humble of <u>my sons</u>, that I am the Virgin Holy Mary, Mother of the true God for whom we live, of the creator of all things, Lord of Heaven and earth. I wish that a Temple be erected here quickly, so I may therein exhibit and give all my love, compassion, help, and protection" She asked him to deliver the message to the Bishop.

The next day, the second encounter with Our Lady, Juan asked her to choose another noble messenger, someone more suitable to deliver her massage. Our Lady responded, "Listen, <u>my little son</u>, be sure that I have many servants and messengers, to whom I must entrust the delivery of my message, and carry my whish, but is of precise detail that you yourself solicit and assist and that through your mediation my wish be complied. I earnestly implore, <u>my son</u> the least, and with sternness I command that you again go tomorrow and see the Bishop."

The following day, the third encounter with Our Lady, Juan tells her that the Bishop had ordered him to ask for a sign. Our Lady responded, "Well and good, my little dear, you will return here tomorrow, so you may take to the Bishop the sign he has requested. With this he will believe you, and in this regard he will not doubt you nor will he be suspicious of you."

It was the next day, the fourth encounter with Our Lady that Juan tried to avoid Our Lady by going around the hill in his quest for a priest to deliver the last rites to his uncle. Not to be denied, Our Lady descended the hill, appeared to him and listened to what he had to say - she responded, "Well and good, my little dear, you will return here tomorrow, so you make take to the Bishop the sign he has requested. With this he will believe you, and in this, am I not here who am your mother? Are you not under my shadow and protection? Am I not the fountain of your joy? Are you not in the fold of my mantle, in the cradle of my arms? Do not grieve nor be disturbed by anything. Do not be afflicted by the illness of your uncle, who will not die now of it, be assured that he is now cured." She then sent him to the top of the hill to cut roses that would be a signal for the bishop. Immediately Juan Diego climbed the hill, and as he reached the summit, he was amazed that so many varieties of exquisite Castilian roses were blooming. He returned to Mary and she said to him: "My son the least, this diversity of roses is the proof and sign which you will take to the Bishop, you will tell him in my name that he will see in them my wish and that he will have to comply with it.

The Virgin of Guadalupe is the Queen of Mexico, the Patron of the Americas. December 12th is the Feast Day of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The miracle of the roses is still manifested in the tilma of Juan, the miracle of the conversion of a nation is evident in the faith of the people of Mexico. In all of this it's easy to miss Our Lady of Guadalupe first introduced herself as the Mother of God and the mother of all humanity when she appeared on the hill of Tepeyac in Mexico in 1531

Prayer of Saint Pope John Paul the II to Our Lady of Guadalupe Grant peace, justice and prosperity to our peoples; for we entrust to your care all that we have and all that we are, our Lady and Mother. We wish to be entirely yours and to walk with you along the way of complete faithfulness to Jesus Christ in His Church; hold us always with your loving hand.
