


Our Parish Family includes Saint Thomas, the Apostle Parish, Saint Thomas, the Apostle School and Saint Anthony of Padua Mission Church.



The Pastors Voice Lessons from Saint Thomas the Apostle Community matters

When Jesus appears to the disciples, Thomas is absent (John 20:24). After seeing the Lord, they run to tell Thomas, but he doesn't believe them. There's little question that Thomas' doubts would have been alleviated sooner if he had simply been with the rest of the apostles as they gathered. It isn't Jesus' intention that we follow Him in isolation from one another. It's incredibly important for us to be connected to and regularly gathering with other Christians. This connection allows us to be encouraged by each other's stories and our shared experiences. As Catholics we see ourselves as part of the mystical Body of Christ. This is why we worship together in our "purest" act of Christian love, the Sacrifice of the Mass. "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Matthew 18:20). So the best part about gathering together as Christians in community is we can be assured that Jesus is there among us. Without that support we find through our community, we have no one around who can build us up, or better yet "stir us up" to love and do those good works that our Lord asks us to do.

Jesus is God

A week after Thomas expresses his uncertainties, Jesus appears to the disciples again-and this time Thomas is among them:

"A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you!" Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe" (John 20:26-27, NIV).

It's probably important to recognize the gentleness that Jesus expresses here. He doesn't chastise Thomas for his lack of faith. Instead, He addresses Thomas in a way that allows him to believe.

In an instant, Thomas goes from not believing that Jesus has risen to recognizing that He is God (John 20:28).
