The Pastors Voice

What is Advent

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says the goal of Advent is to make present for ourselves and our families the "ancient expectancy of the Messiah...by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming." When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming.

The people of Israel waited for generations for the promised Messiah to arrive. Their poetry, their songs and stories, and their religious worship focused on an awaited savior, whom God had promised, over and over, would come to them to set them free from captivity, and to lead them to the fulfillment of all that God had chosen for them. Advent is a season in the Church's life intended to renew the experience of waiting, and longing, for the Messiah. Though Christ has already come into the world, the Church invites us to renew our desire for the Lord more deeply into our lives, and to renew our ardent desire for Christ's triumphant second coming into the world.

The first week of Advent we remember the gift of hope we have in Christ. The prophets of Israel all spoke of the coming of Christ, of how a savior would be born, a king in the line of David. They spoke of how he would rule the world wisely and bless all nations.

The second week of Advent we remember the gift of Peace we have in Christ. Peace is a gift that we must be prepared for and must work for. God gives us the gift of peace when we turn to him working together in faith.

The third week of Advent we remember the gift of Joy we have in Christ. We remember the joy that Mary felt when the angel Gabriel told her that a special child would be born to her - a child who would save and deliver all people. Joy is the gift we all receive from the unconditional love Christ has for us.

The fourth week of Advent we remember the gift of Love we have in Christ. Jesus shows us God's perfect love. He is God's love in human form. The Bible says that "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that whoever believes in him should not perish, but have eternal life."



Catechist Corner

First Sunday of Advent
12/8 - SOLEMNITY of the Immaculate
Conception Wisdom of the Saints;
"Since, by the goodness of God, we who
are called 'Christians' have been granted
the honor of sharing this name – the
greatest, the highest, the most sublime
of all names – it follows that each of the
titles that express its meaning should be
clearly reflected in us. If we are not to lie
when we call ourselves 'Christians,' we
must bear witness to it by our way of
living." St. Gregory of Nyssa (4th century – Doctor of the
Church)
